

The third Be Internet Awesome Conference – March 15th 2023

On March 15th we will take you on a cyber journey during the third edition of our Be Internet Awesome Conference. We will talk about how to be smart and alert online and how to use the full potential of the internet!

What's on the programme?

3:00 p.m. CET – Edustories, inspiring TEDx speeches

- **Mateusz Adamczyk – Does your opinion belong to you? About the language of impact and manipulation**
Do we always think in a certain language? And if so, does language condition this thinking? Is it true that „the limits of our language are the limits of our world”? The answers to these questions not only bring us closer to understanding the nature of language but also sharpen our vigilance against harmful communication activities. One of them is disinformation. How to notice it, what methods it uses, how it affects our way of thinking about the world and finally – how to defend against it? Although it is difficult to give unambiguous answers, even the smallest attempt to provide them is extremely important nowadays.
- **Natalia Walter – What if...?, about situations in which there would be no well-being without technology**
Do we achieve digital well-being by limiting access to technology? Absolutely not! During the speech, Natalia Walter will present the story of two people who experienced an extremely difficult or just difficult life situation (critical event). To deal with such a challenge, they reached for technology. In this way, Natalia will answer the question: can technologies sometimes be a necessary condition for achieving well-being? In addition, she will mention several applications that can be helpful in ensuring well-being, not only the digital one.
- **Patryk Zakrzewski – Prebunking, how to stay ahead of disinformation**
During the speech, I will explain what prebunking is and how it can be used to strengthen resistance against disinformation – both students and my own. Together, we will look at selected manipulation techniques present in the public debate, referring to current examples. All this to tame the topic of misinformation and find the right place for it in the classroom.

- **Dominika Cieřlikowska – About emails that did not go where they were supposed to go and how to improve the paths of reaching them**

During the speech, there will be an opportunity to think about what digital and intercultural competences have in common. You will learn some tips on how to prepare emails and other messages in an international context. We will answer the question of what to pay attention to when writing and speaking to people from other cultures to get along. After this speech, your messages will have a better chance of reaching the indicated person.


4:00 p.m. CET – Online workshops for adults

- **Lidija Kralj – The Myths and the Potential of AI in Education (workshop in English)**
We are going to talk about various examples of the use of artificial intelligence in learning and teaching, discuss the advantages and disadvantages of using artificial intelligence and technology in education and raise awareness about the ethical use of data and artificial intelligence in education.
- **Aurelija Źilionytė – That’s not what I meant! (workshop in English)**
With the power of AI, we will express ourselves when drawing and afterwards discuss and interpret the messages they might be sending.
- **Filip Dębowski – Digital diet (workshop in Polish)**
„You are what you eat” – this well-known saying is true in relation to our body. What if it’s also true for the mind? Technologies enable us to consume a huge amount of information. Their quality and intensity determine the condition of our minds and those of our children. So how do you take care of an information diet? How to build digital awareness? How to use technology so that it serves us – not exhausts us?
- **Agnieszka Halicka – Education redefined – how technologies support the learning process (workshop in Polish)**
Modern technologies can be used in many different ways – as a substitute for a chalkboard or a piece of paper, or as tools that enrich education and create new opportunities.

- **Aneta Korycińska (Baba od polskiego) – Social media in education (workshop in Polish)**
Students use various social media - it is worth knowing them and understanding the differences between them, especially since they have considerable educational potential. During the workshops, the participants will get to know the suggestions of activities in which social media can be used during lessons to interest students and help them learn.
- **Marta Zabłocka – Social responsibility of Internet users (workshop in Polish)**
Regardless of whether we receive or create content online, we have an impact on the world around us. What are we looking for and how do we respond? What and how do we deliver? Are we always aware of this impact? During the workshop, we will not only listen to the story of an experienced Internet user but also talk to the participants about their experiences.
